D-Day “The Second Drop” (Lynn Woods, MA)
Saturday June 14, 2008 – 9:30am-5:00pm

D-Day “The Second Drop” will be a continuation of our past 2007 D-Day Event. This event will provide the mountain bike community a one-day experience to DEMO ride a ton of mountain bikes from various manufactures in Lynn Woods. This event is for all riding levels and many different bikes will be available for YOU to test ride on singletrack. Pending Event: “Bash at Attitash”

“Bash at Attitash” is a similar event to D-Day, however will be geared more towards the downhill/freerider junkie. Tentative dates for this event are Saturday August 09th & Sunday August 10th. Pending Event: IMBA Trail Building School – Lynn Woods

This would be a hosted trail building school presented by IMBA. We have submitted required paperwork to IMBA for this potential trail slated for September 2008 timeframe. At this point in time, this trail day school is still pending. This trail school would focus around building tips and identifying techniques to “winterizing” multi-use trails. In conjunction, review techniques on re-opening the same trails once winter has passed.

TRAIL THREADS

Lynn Woods: Lynn, MA

All has been quiet in Lynn Woods for the month of January. Nothing to report that would cause any alarm in the eyes of Park Management. There have been visible signs of mountain bikes present on sections of trails that are considered closed for this winter period. The visible signs are small and appear to be a few bikes, but we have been asked to restate certain sections of Lynn Woods is closed from January 1, 2008 and will reopen on April 15, 2008.


If you are in need of biking in Lynn Woods, the far north side by the power lines it open year-round. Basically all the trails out behind the Bostonville Pub (Former Big Dog) are open to ride. We have a winter riding map posted on our website. Please feel free to visit this link to view and/or download the *Lynn Woods Winter reference map.

The 2008 trail work proposal has been submitted to Park Management this past month. We have received approval on a few of our proposed trail days and awaiting status for the others. With that said, we have nailed down the dates for these projects and the full announcement for Lynn Woods trail work should be made in next month's newsletter.

For now here are the initial trail dates and general area for work:

Saturday April 26 – Bow Ridge area trail work
 Saturday May 31 – Ballfield area trail work
 Sunday September 14 – Overlook Trail work
 Sunday October 12 – Ballfield area trail work

We have not had any reported issues sent to us regarding this favorite riding spot. All seems quiet with just a few messy spots caused by the weather. As many know, we will keep restating this information for our growing list of newsletter subscribers; the B&T's trail network spans land owned by Essex County Greenbelt and a number of private landowners. The area owned by Essex County Greenbelt is officially known as Tompson Street Reservation. Currently mountain biking as allowed year round, but we ask that you use some common sense when riding there during the winter months. The ground will continuously go through a frost, freeze and thaw transition throughout these winter months. During this time, the trail system is sensitive, so just use common sense when riding.

We have begun or efforts in planning for trail work regarding this area. With much of our Lynn Woods projects under review, we have time to concentrate in opening up out communication efforts with public and private landowners. Our goal is to assembly a B&T's Trail Maintenance Series for 2008. If possible, this will span across both Tompson Street and B&T's areas respectively. At least this is our goal and we will work towards establishing annual trail maintenance at this location. Once again, please remember to respect the sensitive of the B&T's trail network and keep off all private land unless you have permission by the respective landowner.

It is that simple! Without your support, our bike trails will disappear forever.






