SPOOKTACULAR HALLOWEEN MOUNTAIN BIKE FESTIVAL!!!

The Spooktacular Halloween Mountain Bike Festival is just 8 weeks away and we at Dieselbikes are gearing up for this family fun event. What is the Spooktacular Halloween Event? This is a mountain bike social event that allows attendees to participate in a number of different related venues hosted by Dieselbikes and event sponsors. Our goal is to introduce the highlights of the Lynn Woods trail system and provide interactive games that are fun and family orientated. This event will also provide attendees with the potential to ride DEMO bikes, have access to technical information about bike maintenance, local/regional trail maintenance activities/programs along with riding clinics performed by local riders. Sponsoring manufactures, factory reps and local bike shops will be able to showcase their products and/or services one-on-one with attending event participants.

This is a one-day event for mountain bikers of all levels that will include family orientated activities. Event attendees will be able to participate in group rides, biking games and a costume contest. Group rides will be lead by Dieselbikes members and or event sponsors. Event games will be geared to involved sponsors and attendee participation in a competitive contest for prizes. Secondary events such as skill clinics, demo rides, balance beam playground and exhibition shows will be held on and around the main event field. Our plan is to gear this event for all levels of riders and have venues for family members.

Date: Saturday October 25th (In the event of sever rain/stormed, make up day is Sunday Oct. 26th). *Location:* Lynn Woods Great Woods Entrance.

Event Time: Begins at 9:30am and runs until 4:00pm.

Event Admission: \$5.00 - Includes 1 Raffle Ticket and Event Insurance.

CASH Event: Dieselbikes and/or event sponsors will not have the ability to accept credit cards or debit cards at this time. We can accept CASH and Personal Checks as a method of payment. We apologize for any inconveniency this may cause.

Event Wavier Forms: All attendees are required to sign event wavier forms prior to entering into this event. Under 18 must be signed/accompanied by a parent with proper photo ID.

USE OF DEMO BIKES: Each sponsor will have requirements for proper photo ID and completing waiver forms before riding any demo bike. Riders under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent with proper photo ID. Availability of demo bike is on a first come first serve basis.

Dieselbikes Group Rides: Group rides will happen throughout the event. Ride leaders and riding levels will be posted during the event.

Lynn Woods: Lynn, MA

It has been another wonderful month in Lynn Woods with no problems reported regarding mountain biking. There has been an increase of rider-ship this past month and we are receiving positive feedback from park management. Having more individuals using Lynn Woods for recreational purposes regardless they are mountain bikers, hikers or dog walkers is better then riffraff, destructive partying and fires.

This month will be the continuation of Dieselbikes 2008 Trail Maintenance Series. On Sunday September 14th, Dieselbikes will be conducting work on an eroded section of Overlook Trail. This project is phase 2 of the Overlook trail overhaul and our goal is to make this trail more appealing to all park users. Lynnfield 40B Housing Development: Lynnfield, MA

Another housing develop under construction. Is this call progress? Is this destruction of open space or just better utilization of land? Either case can be argued until your blue in the face. The fact remains a new large-scale development has just popped up near our beloved Lynn Woods. Similar to the Bow Ridge development occurring in 2003, this Lynnfield property will provide housing for a number of occupants and bring it's share of problems for us to handle.

We heard about the City of Lynnfield trying to develop a section of property land-locked by Lynn Woods under a proposed Land Swap Agreement with the City of Lynn back in 2005. You can read about this proposed Land Swap by clicking this link. That proposal was denied by the City of Lynn flushing the request down the toilet.

We all believed this would be the last push by Lynnfield to develop land that threatened the trails of Lynn Woods. Six months ago we got a whiff regarding a new development breaking ground near Lynn Woods. We were worried this development was occurring on the proposed land swap property, but after calling the City of Lynn we were assured it was not. We then called over to the City of Lynnfield building department and were told a development would be constructed on property adjacent to Route 1 North. Not much information on exactly where it was, but at least it is not in the middle of Lynn Woods. Three months ago, trees were cleared and boulders were blasted to make way for a new residential development in a location known as Lynnfield Commons. Again, this is not the same property that was under discussion during the proposed land swap, but it is close enough to the Skulls Trail to get a birds eve view of what soon will be more traffic and problems we will need to deal with...

Trail Threads (continues)

Tompson St. Res. / Bruce & Tom's: Gloucester, MA

Last month members from Dieselbikes and NSNEMBA had a productive meeting with Essex County Greenbelt land managers. A fairly extensive trail walk and discussion regarding the current status of Tompson Street's trail system was the main focus. We are happy to say that Greenbelt is extremely friendly to mountain biking and are looking forward to make Tompson Street better for all non-motorized recreational users. There is still much work to be completed but we are moving forward with a second trail workday scheduled to occur on October 4th.

A comprehensive (draft) trail management proposal was submitted to ECG land managers identifying key components related to recreational trail usage. Dieselbikes is taking a similar approach with ECG as with the City of Lynn to enhance this already great riding spot. With assistance from Sinister Bikes and NSNEMBA we feel Tompson Street will become the premiere riding location on the North Shore thus increasing rider ship and reducing riffraff, destructive partying and motorized traffic.

As always, please remember that Tompson Street and B&T's trail networks spans land owned by Essex County Greenbelt and a number of private landowners. Currently mountain biking as allowed year round on Greenbelt managed property called Tompson Street Reservation (TSR) and adjacent private property. We ask that you use some common sense when riding there. Stick to the main trail that you know and do not cut new lines/braids.

If you come across a change in the trail that you think is new and/or illegal, please do not change anything. Dieselbikes, Sinister Bikes and or NSNEMBA have plenty of members that ride this location and will resolve such matters to reduce any potential conflict. There will be new efforts to make the network better and this will take some time to accomplish with proper land manager approval. So again just use common sense when riding.

Product Review — Try All Mountain Uni Rims

Can a trials rim be used for aggressive freeriding? Better yet, can a mountain unicycle rim be used for such a similar beat down? In my search for a somewhat bulletproof mountain bike rim, I just may have found the best-kept secret by mistake. If you know me and know how I ride my bike, you will know that I have no finesse when it comes to riding mountain bikes. I am just as bad as Paul "Crashpad" going through components like a case of beer. With that said, my search for the ultimate rim to handle my abuse has gone on for years...but my search may have just ended.

MAG 30s, Doublewides even Mavic Deemaxs (just to name a few) are mountain bike rims I retired in a season's timeframe. These are all great rims and I would not hesitate to purchase them again because I know a ton or riders that use them with no issues. Most likely these rims were retired to the graveyard because of my poor riding skills and not the quality of the rim. In either case I have accepted the fact that I just may need to purchase new rimes each season. For 2008, I figured I would try something different and go with a rim that had BLING! Searching the Internet I came across gold anodized rims for a mountain unicycle manufactured by Try All Products. I already had a gold theme for my Goatbike and figured these rims would match perfect.

Well, I shelled out the cash for shipping, handling, import charges and associated taxes to get these rims from Europe to my front door. When it was all set and done, one rim cost me about \$125.00 with our lousy exchange rate. I could have purchased a complete wheel for this price, but I said, "what the hell...at least my bike will look good even after I crash!" I had the rims laced to my gold anodized Hadley hubs with black spokes by JRA Cycles back in April. Once I rolled out with these rims my crew gave me crap on how ghetto my bike looked with these drilled out gold spinners, but all were intrigued how long these rims would really last.

Little about this Try All Rim. These rims are 36 hole 47mm wide (1.85") with a 14mm edge doubled walled weighting in at 675grams (rim only). I am not one for weight savings, but fully built with a Hadley hub, 2.7 Intense EX DH Tire and DH tube (or Gazz 3.0 tire 1935g) a single wheel weights in at just under 9.5lbs. These rims have 34-drilled holes through the double wall allowing you to see the rim tap and tube typical of a trials wheel set. These rims are listed for use on a Mountain Unicycle but can be used for bicycles. The extra wide rim allows the tire's sidewall to stand squarer in relation to the thread as it would on a conventional rim. This permits me to run air pressure as low as 10psi but I typical have kept it around 15-18psi even for downhilling. The extra wide rim also helps greatly reduce pinch and/or snake bit flats because the tube is not pinched between the tire thread and rim when you flat the tire on a jump or speed through rock gardens.

The first test ride on these rims was in Lynn Woods on April 19 (opening day). I was extremely pleased with the wheel performance. Even with the wide tire stance and low air pressure, the bike rolled over the trail with much less resistance then having the same tire mounted on a different rim. I attribute this difference due to a stiffer sidewall since the rim is wider allowing a squarer stance. This would be similar to running your tires with 30 to 40psi making the sidewalls stiffer as not to compress during pedaling. But what is one ride...it's meaningless. I will admit I did not think the rims would last, so I purchased a back up rim from a distributor in Canada just incase. After riding multiple times at Sunday River, Attitash, Diablo Freeride, Highland and a host of local riding spots; dropping, hucking and crashing into trees, these rims held up. My poor and sloppy riding style did not compromise the integrity of these rims. Of course, I do check my spokes once per week to ensure everything is tight, cuz if you do not, bad things happen and I learned the hard way...that is another story.
