TRAIL THREADS

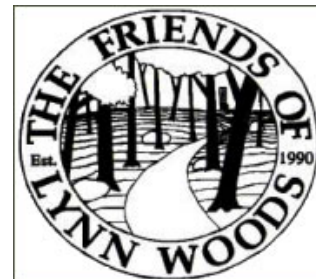
Lynn Woods: Lynn, MA

April Lynn Woods has been officially open for a few weeks and the trails are looking great. There has been little need for any winter clean up thanks to some dedicated volunteers. Downed trees have been cleared by park management, but there will be the need for some brush back on a few trail sections as the spring growing season begins.

In the past week we have noticed that some stone work on the El Sweeny Trail has been moved in a manner that appears malicious. We are not sure of the motivation behind this, but we want to inform the riding community that such activity seems to be taking place. As with other trail systems, Lynn Woods has had its share of malicious activity by individuals with time on their hands. We have moved the stone work back and notified park management.

The Lynnfield Commons housing development has been open for a few months and there are apartments for rent. This housing development is located in Lynnfield just up the road from Lucille's Fine Chicken Restaurant (former Naked Fish) the development backs the playground trails and Skull Rock.

DIESELBIKES PRODUCTS & TRAIL FUNDRAISING

At Dieselbikes we want to stress the importance of supporting your local trail network. Many of us take for granted the trails we ride and the impact we have on those trails as a group. PICK & SHOVEL REPORT

Salem Woods: Salem, MA

On Saturday April 4, the first 2009 Salem Woods trail project was completed with great success. This trail day was coordinated by the Friends of Salem Woods and the City of Salem. Dieselbikes and a number of other local volunteers were on hand to get the job done.

Over 30 volunteers arrived ready for work on a sunny April day. Coffee and donuts were provided as morning fuel for the task of moving 8 cubic yards of crushed stone and mixed dirt. The plan was to elevate approximately 500 feet of existing trail back to its historical height. The City of Salem and the Friends of Salem Woods applied for and received a State Trail Improvement Grant of \$6,560 for the project. The funds were used to purchase the materials necessary for the reconstruction.

In addition to the tons of stone and dirt, a ground stabilizing material called GEO-WEB was used to assist in elevating the trail and provide soil erosion control. The GEO-WEB was laid on the surface of the existing eroded trail thread, topped with crushed stone and finally layered with mixed dirt, fully concealing the stabilizing GEO-WEB underneath.

A continuous conveyor system of volunteers with loaded wheelbarrows moved back and forth all day as other volunteers spread the mixed dirt and stone to rebuild the trail. Deep in the thick of things were Dieselbikes members Pete and Eric assisting in the building of a ladder bridge.

It was a back-breaking trail day, but we at Dieselbikes were happy to play a part. We want to thank all the volunteers and the Friends of Salem Woods for providing coffee, donuts and lunch for everyone. We look forward working with them again on future Salem Woods projects.

Lynn Woods: Lynn, MA

On Sunday April 26 the first 2009 Lynn Woods trail project was completed. It was a hot day and only a limited number of volunteers were available. As a result we scaled back the amount of trail work for the day. The goal had been to build-up and armor the three major turns on the Espresso Trail, we were only able to complete one.

The 85 plus degree weather (crazy for April) did not stop the seven volunteers who worked hard digging, pulling rocks and cutting trees to build up the first switchback turn on the top of Espresso. This switchback was originally cut tight, and we decided to open up the turn by bench cutting the trail line higher into the hillside making a wider turn. We will revisit this trail over the next few weeks making adjustments to refine the berm as needed.

As usual, this was a good sized project and despite the April heat wave, everyone worked hard to complete the task at hand. I want to extend my personal thanks to each of the individuals (listed below) for their hard work in completing the project. Working on a hillside was difficult and back-breaking, and I am grateful for everyone's time and energy. I look forward to seeing everyone again on future trail builds and maintenance projects.

Keep Your Derailleur Happy

Everybody has derailleur problems. Unless your bike is just for show, you're going to have shifting problems. There's no way to stop them. But with some good maintenance techniques, you can really cut down the amount of rides that shifting problems spoil.

The trick is that there is no trick. There isn't one thing you have to do to keep your bike shifting well. There are a bunch of different things, any one of which can cause all sorts of problems.

The first thing goes without saying, always lube your chain. It can make a huge difference in shifting performance.

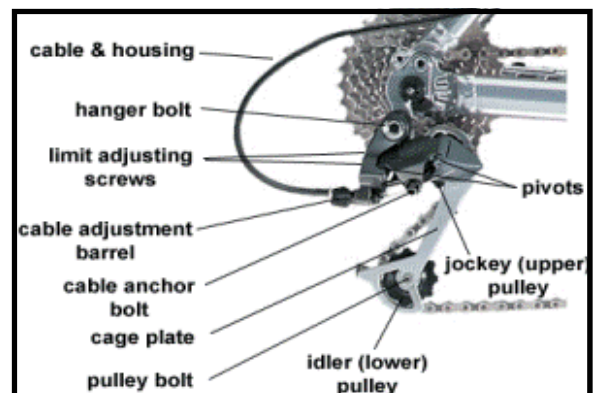


The most common cause of poor shifting is probably the cables.

- a. Old, worn, dirty cables can cause a lot of friction, which will make downshifting difficult. If the cables are really bad, the spring in the derailleur might not be strong enough to counter it, and up shifting might be impossible. Cables are pretty cheap and easy to do yourself, so if you ride in dirty conditions, you might want to just replace them every spring.
- b. The most basic adjustment of your shifter cable is the bolt on the derailleur that pinches the cable. There are a few techniques to attaching this, but here's the way I do it: First tighten the barrel adjuster knob (more on that in a minute) on your shifter and derailleur if it has one. These are hand-turn knobs. Turn them to the right until the inner bolt is all the way 'in'. Now let the spring in your derailleur shift the chain all the way to the smallest gear in the rear. Adjust your shifter to match, so if the cable was working, it would shift into the smallest gear. Now full the cable firm with a pair of pliers and tighten the clamp bolt, with as little movement of the derailleur as possible. This can be tricky; it might take a few tries. Once you have it on, you're not done yet, you then have to move on to the next step...
